



**THE DOCUMENTS LISTED BELOW MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH APPLICATION FOR EACH PRACTITIONER:**

1. Provide a copy of your current Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Training Certification that is consistent with Cal-OSHA and California Health and Safety Code Requirements.
2. Provide documentation of current Hepatitis B Vaccination, including applicable boosters, or demonstrate Hepatitis B immunity, or provide proof of compliance to current Federal OSHA Hepatitis B Vaccination Declination requirements.
3. Attach a copy of current/valid Body Art Practitioner registration issued in California.

**THE FOLLOWING ITEMS SHALL BE AVAILABLE IN THE BODY ART BOOTH AT TIME OF INSPECTION:**

1. Client consent forms, single use instrument logs, written aftercare instructions, and client medical history questionnaires.
2. If shared handwashing stations are not provided throughout the venue, then a handwashing station consisting of a 5-gallon container of potable water accessible via a spigot, wastewater container of corresponding size, bottle of liquid hand soap, and disposable paper towels must be provided inside each booth.
3. Partition of at least 3 feet in height separating the procedure area from the public.
4. Personal protection equipment – Nitrile or latex gloves, disposable aprons, lap bibs, etc.
5. Adequate lighting in the procedure area where body art activity is performed.
6. A sharps waste container for disposal of single-use needles, razors, razor blades or other sharp items capable of cutting.
7. Disinfectant approved by EPA or Department of Pesticide Regulation to decontaminate surfaces.
8. Green Soap or an antiseptic solution used for the preparation of the body art procedure site.
9. Jewelry that is placed in newly pierced skin must be made of ASTM F138, ISO 5832-1, and AISI 316L or AISI 316LVM implant-grade stainless steel, solid 14-karat through 18-karat yellow or white gold, niobium, ASTM F 136 6A4V titanium, platinum, or other materials found to be equally biocompatible.
10. Pre-sterilized and packaged jewelry.
11. Pre-sterilized and packaged needles.
12. Pre-sterilized and packaged needle tubes and bars.
13. Pre-sterilized and packaged piercing instruments, including needles, forceps, and receiving tubes.
14. Disposable tooth picks, ink cups, corks, and marking tools.
15. Commercial manufactured inks, dyes, and pigments.
16. Plastic disposable protective sheaths for workstation equipment, including chairs, tray, tattoo machine and clip cord, plastic bags, barrier film, and plastic wrap.
17. Disposable, single-use, pre-sterilized instruments only.
18. Single-use tubes of water-based and petroleum-based lubricants.
19. Sterile dressings to cover the tattoo after a procedure.

The temporary certificate of registration to perform body art at the event will be issued upon completion of this application, payment of all registration fees, and inspection of the body art procedure booth to verify compliance with California Health and Safety Code, Section 119317 and 119318. It may be revoked if the registrant fails to comply with the California Health and Safety Code and amendments thereof, in the performance of tattooing, body piercing, branding, and permanent cosmetics. Each practitioner working in a booth at a temporary body art event shall display his or her certificate of registration, or keep the certificate in a folder that is available for inspection upon request by the enforcement officer or a client.

**Note: Body art facilities that do not have sterilization equipment or have access to a decontamination and sterilization area, must provide only disposable, single-use, pre-sterilized instruments and pre-sterilized jewelry. Records of purchase and use of all single-use instruments, a log of all procedures (name of practitioner, name of client, and date of procedure), and written proof on company or laboratory letterhead showing that the pre-sterilized instruments have undergone a sterilization process must be maintained on-site. Written proof shall clearly identify the instruments sterilized by name or item number and shall identify the lot or batch number of the sterilizer run.**
